DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN PENNSYLVANIA

In one day in 2020, PA domestic violence hotlines received 1,045 calls, averaging 44 calls per hour. On the same day, 2,574 survivors were served by PA domestic violence programs.

DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023, ROADS TO PEACE:

Received 477 hotline calls

- Served 433 men, women, and their dependent children, and 24 self-identifying LGBTQ+ people
- Provided 1,221 hours of counseling, advocacy, and support to survivors of domestic violence
- Provided emergency shelter to 62 survivors of domestic violence
